This class is set up using high technological computer graphics, Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator, PageMaker, Dreamweaver, and Quark Express so that the students may benefit from a true-to-life working experience in the field of art. Students will be asked to design their own business in which they begin with their logo and follow through with business cards, newspaper ads, brochures, invitations, letterheads, and a home page. In using graphics, emphasis will be placed on creativity using many mixed media, layout design, and composition. The student will be expected to do some investigation into the wide range of commercial art careers.

Art - Painting I

Painting I applies concepts of color theory, color as a value, and color as both a means of describing form and as a compositional device. In addition, it introduces basic techniques in painting with acrylic, including painting as an extension of drawing from observation, and painting for expression of ideas and emotions. Early lessons will address basic ideas and techniques, with increasing emphasis on individual expression as the semester progresses. Frequent attempts will be made to relate concepts to examples from art history.

Art - Watercolor

Watercolor studies examples of past watercolors in addition to painting exercises, which will include sketching used as a preparatory study and as a finished work. Although watercolor is a simple material, it has proven to be one of the more difficult media for artists to master. Therefore students will work with exercises in value, color intensity, glaze buildups (washes), and developing a visual acuity for the reflection of light off the white paper and back through the washes to produce the charming luminosity that is so special to watercolor. Additionally, exercises will be provided in other adaptations of watercolor, through the use of computer graphics.
