# **SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GOALS**

**ELA:** Pronghorn students will exceed the overall state performance level for proficient and advanced students as measured by the WY-TOPP assessment. Pronghorn is targeting our core instruction through the implementation of Panorama, UFLI, and Heggerty. All of our students are given the FastBridge screener, teachers look for specific skills to target, and we progress monitor our students to provide the correct support to promote continuous growth. With support of the Sam R. Ratcliff grant, we were able to purchase Guided Reading resources that we can use from Kindergarten through 6th grade.

**MATH:** Pronghorn students will exceed the overall state performance level for proficient and advanced students as measured by the WY-TOPP assessment. Each year we see improvement in math as our staff and students implement the Eureka Math program, and supplement strategies through AVMR.

**SCIENCE:** Pronghorn 4<sup>th</sup> grade students will continue to meet or exceed the State average in Science. We recognize that our students' foundation and experiences are developed in the previous grades that lead to 4<sup>th</sup> grade and it is a team effort. Then the skills are further developed and refined in 4<sup>th</sup> grade so the students are prepared to achieve at a high level.

**WELL-BEING:** Pronghorn has begun having monthly whole school assemblies to introduce the *Character Strong* trait of the month, and the trait continues to be supported through classroom lessons with the teacher and counselor. Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) is being revitalized during our team meetings. Clear expectations of the students are practiced, and students are able to earn "Spike Tags" to redeem prizes at our School Store.

# **ACCOUNTABILITY REPORT GOALS**

**GROWTH:** Pronghorn will increase our score by at least 3 points to meet expectations as measured by the 2023-2024 WAEA School Performance Report. With Mr. Knox's and Mr. Crosby's assistance, we were able to analyze our WY-TOPP data and identify subgroups that need added assistance. School teams will monitor these students closely for academic growth.

**EQUITY:** Pronghorn will maintain a score of meeting expectations on the equity indicator as measured by the 2023-2024 WAEA School Performance Report.

**ACHIEVEMENT:** Pronghorn will maintain a score of meeting expectations on the achievement indicator as measured by the 2023-2024 WAEA School Performance Report.

**ELP:** Pronghorn will increase our score by at least 9 points to be meeting ELP expectations as measured by the 2023-2024 WAEA School Performance Report. Currently, Pronghorn has 1 student with an Individual English Learner Plan (IELP), and two students that have passed the ACCESS assessment and are continuing to be monitored.
