Public Comment	There were no public comments.
Middle City State Enrollment Projections	Mr. Dihle reviewed the 15/16 Middle City States Enrollment Projection Report as well as additional enrollment insight based on current economic trends. The expectation is for the district's enrollment to decrease over the next couple of years; however, the junior high enrollment is expected to increase based on current large class numbers in the elementary schools. The financial impact of the reduced enrollment is expected to be approximately \$600,000 in lost revenue for next year.
Legislative Update	Mr. Eisenhauer provided a review of the 2016 legislative session which ended March 4. Of significant impact to the district was approval of the funding for the track and playfield at Thunder Basin High School which was part of the School Facilities Department budget. Also having a huge impact to the district was the budget bill which cut education funding through a reduction to ECA. A 1% cut to

	ECA funding in FY17 will cost the district approximately \$1.4 million, and a 1.4% cut to ECA funding in FY18 will cost the district approximately \$2.0 million. These cuts are in addition to the reduction in funding that will occur if enrollment goes down because the funding model self-adjusts to account for reduced enrollment.
	Mr. Eisenhauer also noted that interim topics likely will include ECA and transportation funding.
Comments from Trustees	There were no comments from trustees.
