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Salary and Benefit Dr. Strahorn reviewed proposed salary schedules for administrative, Recommendations certified, ESP, supervisors/managers/contracted exempt and non-exempt personnel, nurses, and substitute teachers/nurses and requested approval. He noted this would be the third largest raise in the most recent twenty years or so. Following discussion, Mrs. Shippy moved to approve the proposed salary schedules, Mrs. Hepp seconded, and the motion carried approving the following changes: **Certified** - Increase base salary from \$43,000 to \$46,000 - 6.98% increase; maintain experience step at \$1,100 and educational advancement step at \$1,200; and allow advancement of one experience step for those not currently topped out. Administrator - Increase base by 6/98%; allow advancement of one experience step for those not currently topped out. Educational Support Personnel - Increase base from \$8.95 to \$9.22 and change all salary increments in the schedule - 3% increase; allow one experience step for those not currently topped out. Supervisors/Managers/Contracted Exempt - Increase base from \$31,058 to \$31,990 and change all salary increments - 3% increase; allow advancement of one experience step for those not currently topped out. Salaried/Non-Exempt Employees - Increase base from \$32,776 to \$33,759 and change all salary increments - 3% increase; allow advancement of one experience step for those not currently topped out. Nurse - Non-Bachelor Schedule - Increase base from \$33,591 to \$35,935 - 6.98% increase; maintain experience step at \$1,100 Substitute Teachers and Substitute Nurses - Increase daily rate from \$95 to \$105; increase long-term substitute teacher daily rate from \$105 to \$125; increase substitute nurse daily rate from \$95 to \$125. Masters Class Introduction Dr. Brown noted the presence of several individuals in the audience who are enrolled in Dr. Heslep's class. Preliminary 2009-2010 Dr. Brown reviewed the preliminary budget in the total amount of \$212,206,080.72. Following extensive review and limited discussion, Mr. Budget Pecha made a motion to approve the preliminary budget, Ms. Hepp seconded, and the motion carried. Health Insurance Update Mr. Reznicek reviewed the current and proposed rates for the health insurance program. He noted the program is anticipating a 15% increase in premium rates, and the proposed rates accommodate that increase. Mr. Pecha made a motion to approve the proposed rate increases, Mr. Blikre seconded, and the motion carried. The following will be the new rates beginning in January 1, 2010: **Executive Session** Following a motion by Mrs. Shippy and second by Ms. Hepp to recess for an executive session to discuss litigation, personnel and land acquision, the motion carried and the Board recessed to executive session at 9:35 p.m and reconvened at 10:29 p.m. Adjournment With no other business before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 10:29 p.m.
