	The board recessed at 8:30 p.m. and reconvened at 8:38 p.m.
Bus Lease	Mr. Eisenhauer reviewed the district bus replacement criteria and the Lease and Option to Purchase Buses Agreement with First National Bank, and asked for approval to enter into the agreement to purchase eighteen new buses. Mr. Foreman made a motion to approve the agreement, and Mrs. Durgin seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.
Legislative Update	Mr. Eisenhauer provided a legislative update.
	Senate File 53 has been signed into law allowing for veteran hiring preference in the screening process.
	House Bill 58 has been signed into law which provides \$20,900,000.00 in funding for component construction projects. CCSD has three projects that will qualify for that funding: Sunflower Roof, Rozet Roof, and CCHS Boiler Plant.
	House Bill 194 has not yet been signed into law, but if the governor doesn't veto the bill, it automatically becomes law. This bill allows school boards to establish procedures and guidelines for employees to carry firearms in schools.
	House Bill 236 reduced education funding across the state by \$34.5 million. The total of the various budget cuts CCSD can expect is approximately \$5.8 million. Mr. Eisenhauer commented that spending is down for this year, so we will have some rollover funds to apply to help offset the funding reduction. The board also discussed using some reserve funds to help meet district needs. Discussions will begin with district leadership to help identify potential cuts, and those options will be brought back to the board for discussion.
Facilities Update	 Mr. Eisenhauer provided an update on the following facilities: Meadowlark Elementary School – This project is going well. The construction crew is working evenings right now, and plan to have the project completed by the start of school next year. Thunder Basin High School – This project is going well. Large box spaces are available to store furniture, fixtures, and equipment for areas that aren't completed yet. Thunder Basin High School Stadium – Some irregularities with the soil have been noted. The district is waiting for the most recent soil sample results. Soil remedies and weather may delay completion of the stadium. CCHS-N Stadium Lights – The district has been approached by a cell phone company who wishes to install a cell tower at the CCHS-N stadium sight. The company would pay for one of the three needed replacement lights. This would save the Rec Mill an estimated \$125,000.00 on the project. Mr. Eisenhauer is working with the cell phone company representative to verify that the structure
	is sufficient for the light pole. Mrs. Bell asked to discuss use options for the Thunder Basin High School Stadium. Mrs. Bell made a motion to use Thunder Basin High School stadium as a shared stadium for both Thunder Basin High School and Campbell County High School. Mrs. Hladky seconded the motion. Mr. Foreman, Dr. Clouston, Dr. Fall, Mrs. Ochs, and Mrs. Durgin voted "no"; and Mrs. Hladky and Mrs. Bell voted "yes". The motion did not carry.
Executive Session	Mr. Foreman made a motion to adjourn to executive session for the purpose of litigation discussion. Mrs. Ochs seconded the motion, and the motion carried. The regular board meeting adjourned at 9:40 p.m. and reconvened at 10:28 p.m
Adjournment	With no other business before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 10:28 p.m.
