CONSENT AGENDA ENDS

STEM Update

Principals and technology teachers from Prairie Wind Elementary, Paintbrush Elementary, Wagonwheel Elementary, and Conestoga Elementary updated the board on how things are going with their STEM Labs, and their vision for the future with the labs. Twin Spruce Junior High and Sage Valley Junior High principals updated the board on the first semester with STEM Labs in their schools and their thoughts moving forward.

Discussion was had regarding a potential STEM facilitator. The district will start designing STEM curriculum now rather than waiting for computer science standards to be determined by the Wyoming Department of Education.

STEM Labs

Mr. Eisenhauer provided information on possible ways the district can work with the college and Area 59 to provide STEM opportunities at the high schools. Mr. Eisenhauer also requested approval of up to six additional elementary school STEM Labs. Dr. Lawrence made a motion to approve up to six more STEM Labs in elementary schools with the three rural schools counting as one. Mr. Foreman seconded the motion, and the motion carried unanimously.

Elementary schools currently without STEM Labs will have an opportunity to present to the board on February 26. Presentations will begin at 4 pm, and each school will be allocated 15 minutes to present. The rural schools will present as one school.

Legislative Update

A legislative update was presented. Administration is closely watching the following legislation: External Cost Adjustment; HB24, National Board Certification; HB22,

Teacher Accountability; SF120 which addresses hearing requirements with regards to student expulsions, and SF75 which repeals gun free school zone legislation.

Policies

Dr. Reznicek presented the *Prohibited Assistance to Sex Offender* policy for final reading and asked the board to adopt the policy. Mr. Foreman made a motion to adopt the Prohibited Assistance to Sex Offender policy, and Mrs. Bricker seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Dr. Reznicek presented revisions to *Policy 5275 and Administrative Regulation 5275-R*, *Student Sexual Harassment* and asked for adoption of the revisions. Mr. Foreman made a motion to adopt the revisions, and Mrs. Bell seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Ochs expressed thankfulness that the board took on the goal of providing STEM education. Dr. Clouston celebrated our increase of 5.2% for on-time graduation rates. Mr. Foreman encouraged everyone to come to Thunder Basin High School Friday evening and watch some really great basketball!

Adjournment With no other business before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:10 pm.
