Legislative Update

Mr. Holmes provided a legislative update. SF80 which addresses penalties for failing to stop for a school bus with flashing red lights, and HB22 which addresses teacher evaluations have been signed by Governor Gordon. HB308, Modernizing and Balancing Wyoming's School Funding Streams is in conference. SF1 and HB1 which contain the ECA remain unsigned by the Governor. HB183 and SF75, Repeal Gun Free Zones and Preemption Amendments have both died. The district will move forward with collecting public comment regarding armed educators.

February 27 is scheduled as the last day of the legislative session.
